# \*\*NEW\*\* STZ'UMINUS HUL'Q'UMI'NUM' Junior Kindergarten/ Kindergarten IMMERSION PROGRAM: September 2022

We are so excited to start this journey with you, our first-ever Immersion program. This year will be open to our junior kindergarten and kindergarten families (birthdays between 2019 - 2017). Here are some important details:

- The classroom team will have a Hul'q'umi'num' speaking teacher, an educational assistant and an Elder. The program will run out of the SPS schools.
- We will enrol on a first come first served basis
- We will enrol 16 students
- Priority will be given to Stz'uminus band members
- We will hold a wait list
- Registration OPENS Monday June 6<sup>th</sup> at 8 am

This is a brand-new program, there will be lots of learning and growing together as this program will align as best as possible to the Stz'uminus language and culture.

# \*\*NEW\*\* TAKE A HIKE PROGRAM: September 2022



Another program we are excited to share with you is the Take a Hike program. This program is for students going into grades 10 to 12. Take a Hike empowers youth with intentional, continuous clinical counselling, outdoor experiential learning, and community. The program will be built from the foundation of the Stz'uminus cultural calendar, learning will be deeply immersed in culture and on the land. The SCS team will provide high-quality education, and together with Take a Hike, we empower youth with the skills and resilience they need to graduate high school, build healthy relationships, and achieve success – however they define it.

#### The details:

- Full time graduation program
- Maximum 18 students
- Grade 10 to 12 students
- Program will be located out of the newly renovated building on Silverstrand Road
- Students will go through an interview process for acceptance.
- Priority will be given to those from Stz'uminus First Nation
- Students must maintain 80% attendance or more
- Registration OPENS Monday June 6<sup>th</sup> at 8 am

#### **NEW SCS TIMETABLE**

The students have asked for a new timetable for grade 8 to 12! After much collaboration we are excited to share what they have come up with!

#### Structure:

Block 1 (1 hour, core subject)
Block 2 (1 hour, core subject)
Block 3 (1 hour, core subject)
Lunch
Superblock (2 hours, 7 weeks, elective, 4 terms/courses)

#### Advantages of new timetable:

- This will allow students to rotate to different teachers and teachers will be able to teach in their specialty areas.
- Math, English and Hul'q'umi'num' will run all year long (linear)
- With superblocks being 2 hours long, students can dig deeper into their learning skill (such as science labs, shop projects, or art projects) and/or students will be able to leave campus for their learning (such as fishing, canoeing, harvesting, clamming, hiking, hockey or rock climbing)
- School day start and stop times may need to be adjusted slightly

### Course selections are happening now!

We will be running many new electives next year, most of which were derived from the voices of the student body and from our elders. We hope that our community members become more and more involved in our teachings either at SCS or within the community.

# **KINDERGARTEN**

The kindergarten has been an exciting place to be! We have visited Yellow Point Farms to see the baby animals, gone to the swimming pool in Duncan, continued to study our potatoes and bean plants, and decorated a picnic table that will soon be put outside. Every day we rush into the classroom to check our butterflies that arrived on May 9 as larvae, then grew into bigger caterpillars and are now chrysalis in our butterfly habitat. Today we had two that emerged as butterflies!





### **GRADE 1**

May was a busy and exciting month for the grade 1 class. We went on a field trip with the grade 2's to Hamilton Hobby Farm, where we spent time with 3 very cute bunnies, feed the goats and chickens, saw new-born baby goats and went on pony rides. The kids were excited and had a blast! We have been learning about the life cycle of a butterfly, after reading the story "The Very Hungry Butterfly" by Eric Carle. The kindergarten class was lucky to have 10 caterpillars and over the days invited us to watch the caterpillars transform into painted lady butterflies! We have also been doing buddy reading with the grade 4's which everyone is enjoying! As we wind down the school year, we have a more fun activities planned as well as continuing to work hard on our reading and writing!

#### Beach life!

Grade 4 took a close look at clams. We went to Kulleet Bay at low tide, got advice from an expert, and did a little digging of our own. We brought the clams back to the classroom and each student had a chance to dissect (cut up) a clam and find the **siphon** (for intake and elimination) the **foot** (for escaping into the sand) and the two halves of the bivalve (the two shells). We examined the clams under a microscope and created labeled diagrams of the clams in our nature journals.

We talked about how this resource has been in Stz'uminus for thousands of years, and we discussed how important it is that we all do our best to keep the oceans and beaches healthy, because we are all part of the food chain.

I have really enjoyed my time with this beautiful group of students. Huy tseep qa to all the families for your support as I worked with your children over the past two years. I look forward to sharing more memories and a trail book we are creating with Riley at the upcoming grade 4 graduation awards ceremony. See you then!
